
Mask Wearing

Last week, the BC provincial government expanded its provincial Health and Safety measures with a mandate of mask wearing in schools for students from Kindergarten – Grade 12. HEALTH CHECK.

Students feeling sick should remain at home while waiting for test results, Fraser Health authorities will advise on individual return to school conditions and timelines for students.



Parents/guardians are required to assess their children daily and disclose whether they are experiencing any signs of illness and are expected to keep them home if they are.
